1. Meeting called to order at 12:27 Roll call for quorum.

2. Review Agenda

We will change the order of the agenda. MLA Dan Williams is unable to join us in person so we will do the Highlights at the beginning of the meeting before our Auditor joins us by phone.

3. Approval of the 2018 Minutes

The 2018 AGM Minutes were provided on the Members Portal prior to the Meeting. MOTION to approve the 2018 Minutes as presented by Garrett Tomlinson. Carried.

4. Review and Highlights from 2018/19

Karla Reesor and Mike Bisaga provided an overview of PRAMP results from 2018/19:

- PRAMP has always been a collaborative effort between government, industry and the community.
- Ten directors from Industry, community, and government including Indigenous groups.
- Staff team includes Executive Director, two Technical Program Mangers, and Office Manager; as well as Field Operations Assistant and Education and Outreach Coordinator.
- Funding is provided through a contract from AEP from the Oilsands Monitoring Program as well as an Outreach grant from AEP.
- Engagement and outreach includes participation in tradeshows, presentations to municipal councils, quarterly newsletters, social media and monthly data reports
- PRAMP is a member of the Alberta Airsheds Council. We collaborate with other Airsheds for communication materials, sharing costs and resources.
- During the wildfire smoke events, we worked with government departments to share information on the impacts of wildfire smoke with the public.
- The PRAMP monitoring network is made up of continuous monitoring stations at Reno, secondary highway 842 and 986. We have a portable AQHI monitoring station that will be online shortly and the PRC station is currently operated by the industrial operator and is in the process of moving over to the Airshed.
- In the past year we have moved two of our monitoring stations (986 and 842).

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- Monitoring methods include continuous, intermittent canister sampling, passive and this year we will be introducing small sensors (Purple Air devices).
- A short overview of historical data was provided
- Frequency of elevated hydrocarbon events has come down over time.
- Frequency of triggered canister events has come down over time as well.
- Both methane and non-methane canister samples are now being collected.
- Ongoing monitoring and assessment is required.
- The new portable monitoring station will report AQHI for the Peace River area. The AQHI is available on an easy to use AQHI app and on weather forecasting apps.
- The portable station could be moved at 18-month intervals
- PRAMP will be looking for opportunities to reach out to schools to deliver education programs.

5. Presentation of Audited Financial Statements for 2019

• The audited financial statements were presented by Edwin Radke of Radke Corporation. MOTION to approve the financials by Andy Trudeau and second by Krista Park. No blocks.

6. Call for Directors

- Karla Reesor confirmed the list of current directors
- Three incumbent directors have agreed to stand again Shelly Shannon as a Community representative, Corinna Williams from Northern Sunrise County (Government) and Andy Trudeau from the Municipal District of Smoky River (Government).
- Karla called for nominations from the floor (3 times); hearing none, all three incumbents were acclaimed.
