Item 5B: Mail out to PRAMP Stakeholders following AGM

Decision Requested: Board support for a staff letter to PRAMP stakeholders

Background

In early February 2021, PRAMP staff (Executive Director) sent by email a letter to PRAMP stakeholders inviting their input for the PRAMP strategic planning process. Most stakeholders either participated in a meeting with staff or provided comments by email.

Proposed Action

Staff is proposing to send a letter to the same stakeholders (municipalities, community members, industry representatives and provincial government representatives) to let them know how their input was considered and to share the updated PRAMP Goals and Strategies. In addition, a copy of the 2020-21 Annual Report to the Community, a 2022 PRAMP Calendar and a brief document acknowledging PRAMP's five years as a not-for-profit air monitoring organization will be included.

The package would be mailed to stakeholders after the 2021 Annual General Meeting.

The Goals and Strategies shown in Attachment 1 were approved by the Board on June 24, 2021.

Staff is seeking Board support to send a letter of thanks and the items noted to PRAMP stakeholders.
