1.3 Meeting Notes

Motion to approve the September 27, 2022 Meeting Notes by Amanda Peardon. Carried.

1.4 Executive Committee Roles

Each year following the Annual General Meeting we hold an election of the Executive. The positions are two year terms and each of the Community (Doug Dallyn) and Industry (Amanda Peardon) Chair have a year left on their terms. The Government Chair and Secretary Treasurer positions are terms are both up for election.

Garrett Tomlinson has indicated he is willing to stay on in the position as Government Co-Chair. Shelly Shannon has indicated she is willing to stay in the position as Secretary/Treasurer.

Nominations for both positions of Government Co-Chair and Secretary/Treasurer were called for three times from the floor.

2. Monitoring and Reporting

Goal:

1. Evidence-driven verification that air quality in the Peace River area is at acceptable levels and that emissions are being minimized.

2.1 PRAMP Data Reports

- The Dashboard Reports to the end of September have been posted to the website. https://prampairshed.ca/wp-content/uploads/2022/09/Tech-Update.pdf
- September 986 precipitation gauge had a loose wire to the data logger.
- 842 methane analyzer was replaced.
- AQHI station recorded high AQHI readings because of wildfires in BC.

2.2 Reno Station Relocation

- In late November, the equipment from the old Reno station was transitioned to the new
- The old station has been removed from the old location.
- December will be the first full month of monitoring at the new location.

2.3 Annual Data Review Highlights

- The 2021 Annual Data Review was shared in advance of the meeting.
- Mike presented an overview of the 2021 Annual Data Review.

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- The Report was provided to the Technical Working Group for review and comments were incorporated where appropriate.
- Previous report was a comparison of previous year (ie. Last one was 2019/2020). Now report summarizes the year (2021) and data is presented in a more concise way.
- Motion to accept the 2021 Annual Data Review as final by Jason Javos. No blocks.

3. Education and Outreach

Goals:

- 2. Residents and stakeholders have timely access to air quality data and information in a manner that is readily understood
- 3. Educators, community groups and citizens can access resources to increase understanding of and promote healthy air quality

4. Recognized as an independent not-for-profit organization and Airshed that is focused on continuous improvement and responsible leadership in air quality monitoring

4.1 Monthly Financial Report

Motion to approve the financial reports for information for September and October by Krista. Carried.

We have received verbal confirmation from Alberta Environment and Protected Areas (AEPA) that PRAMP will be receiving our Outreach grant for 2023. We expect to hear formally in January.

5. New Business

5.1 Network Assessment

- Summary slides for the Network Assessment recommendations are available on the Members' Portal.
- The final Ambient Air Quality Network Evaluation Report prepared by AECOM was presented to the TWG and the Board.
- The Report incorporated feedback received from staff, the TWG and from the AGM presentation.
- With the exception of the PRC passive monitoring program, there were no major network rationalization or optimization recommendations in the Network Assessment report.
- The network assessment analyzed 3 priority areas:
 - 1. Assess the performance of the network after the implementation of Directive 84
 - There may be alternative ways to monitor SO2 as concentrations are very low
 - TRS appears to be seasonal
 - 2. Add PRC and Mercer stations to the Network

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- Are there opportunities to add value to these sites; AQHI enhancement in Peace River
- 3. Consideration of spatial gaps in monitoring and the potential for emerging technology
 - Monitoring in gap areas is likely only justifiable through the use of low-cost, small sensor technologies and with existing monitoring assets (portable station)

Recommendations:

PRC Passive – if CNRL wants to pursue a change to its regulatory approval, PRAMP could provide information to support a recommendation to eliminate or optimize the passive network – the passive network is close together and the parameters are being monitored by continuous monitoring.

Purple Air calibration – no action is recommended at this time; stay engaged with partners who are already working on small sensors. Purple Air sesnors cannot be calibrated however algorithms have been developed to improve the cold-weather accuracy of the data in Canada (ie UNBC website). Typically, when there is a performance issue, the only way to remedy the problem is to replace the PurpleAir Sensor.

Low cost sensors and AQHI – no action recommended at this time; stay engaged with partners who are already working on small sensors.

Canister System Alternative – low cost sensors may provide continuous or semi-continuous measurements. Consider a phased-in transition of alternative monitoring technologies at the end of PRAMP's current commercial analyzers' lifecycle.

Motion to accept the AECOM Network Assessment as complete and final and pay the final invoice by Art Laurin; second by Shelly Shannon. No blocks

Next steps

- review the data and formulate what should happen next with the PRC passive network.
- Explore real time alternative options to canisters
- Continue to stay engaged with AAC Technical Committee on small sensor technology

Motion to support staff investigating next steps included in the Network Assessment summary by Amanda Peardon. No blocks.
